



Things To Remember . . . ***Ocean Blue's Tips Of What To Do's & Not To Do's***

- We will communicate on Channel 69.
- Most cell phones do not work in the Bahamas.
- Clean the bottom of your boat.
- Full fuel. Service engines.
- Spare Parts (see suggested Parts List). Parts are expensive in the Bahamas.
- If you are 30 amp service, you will need a 50 amp converter.
- Tow Boat US Membership is very helpful.
- Insurance waiver for Bahamas.
- Passports for all on boat & Drivers License. Bahamas no longer accepts birth certificates.
- Vessel registration and documentation.
- Boats 35' and under, Bahamas will charge you entry fee of \$150.00. 35' and over will be charged \$300.00. This covers four persons on board. \$25.00 for each additional person.
- U.S. Customs sticker (you can get this online for \$25.00).
- You must clear customs upon your return to the U.S. at an international airport.
- Please provision properly. If you forget something, most of the islands have small grocery stores, but may not have what you need or want.
- Portable grill. Charcoal or propane for it. Tin foil.
- Tons of bottled water and any soft drinks or beer. It is expensive in the Bahamas.
- A dinghy is the best toy for the islands.
- It is NOT lobster season.
- Bring fun gear—snorkel or dive equipment, camera, fishing gear, small cooler for day trips, any and all types of water toys.
- Keep water tank full (most islands charge by the gallon).
- Discharge head on the way back to the states (NOT within 3 miles of shore)
- Bahamian, U.S. and quarantine flags.
- Magma Grill (you can find this at Boat U.S.)
- Extra propane for your grill.
- Remember, YOU are on vacation . . . So let's have fun!!!
